PUBLIC BUS FARES – Bus fares are changing for 13 to 24-year-olds from 1st May. Half-price fares for ages 13 to 24 are ending due to the government's decision to stop funding these subsidies. Fares are cheaper with a <u>registered Bee Card</u>, so buy one and get it registered online now. From 1st May, Bee Card fares* are:

- Dunedin youth aged 13-18: \$1.20 per single trip.
- Ages 19+: \$2 per single trip.

*fares are higher without a Bee Card. Fares are still free for children under 13 with a registered Bee Card – now funded by Otago Regional Council.
