Queer: Queer is a term used by people who reject traditional gender identities and seek a broader, less restrictive understanding of gender and sexuality. It is an inclusive term that can refer to anyone who feels outside of the societal norms in terms of gender identity or sexual orientation. This can include, but is not limited to, people who identify as lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, non-binary, or pansexual.

Celebrity Highlight: Jonathan Van Ness is a television personality, hair stylist, and activist, best known for his role on the popular Netflix series "Queer Eye." Jonathan identifies as non-binary and uses they/he/she pronouns, embracing a fluid understanding of gender. They are also openly queer, advocating for LGBTQ+ rights and using their platform to promote acceptance and understanding. Jonathan's visibility and candidness about their identity have made them an influential figure in the LGBTQ+ community, inspiring many to embrace their true selves.
