ROWING WITH KHS AND NERC - If King's High School students would like to experience rowing, North End Rowing Club (NERC) are having an Open day on Saturday 19th October at 54 Magnet St Dunedin. Potential rowers are invited to come along at 9am to try-out rowing and / or to sign up for the KHS 'Learn to Row' programme. Hayden George, Captain of North End Rowing Club, explains: "King's High School 'Learn to Row' is a 5-week introduction to rowing programme, where you learn the basics about rowing. Rowing in a team offers a unique depiction of team building and demonstrates what a team can look like when all members are working as one. Rowing is one of the most physically demanding sports. Unlike many other sports, rowing uses practically every muscle in the body. Rowing is also the most successful sport at the Olympics for New Zealand over the years. Many scholarships for overseas universities are available for successful NZ rowers." If you'd like to try out rowing at the NERC Open day, wear warm, close-fitting sport clothes that you are happy getting wet (such as shorts, socks and long-sleeved top / sports hoodie / slide or trainers) and bring a towel and change of clothes. You are also very welcome to join the School Crews at NERC from 10.30 am on Saturday 19th October as they look forward to the coming year. King's High School Rowing Crew row out of NERC, along with rowers from Queen's and St Hilda's Collegiate.
